

CABINETMAKING WITH MARC ADAMS

TOOL LIST

The following is a list of the hand tools that you should bring to the Cabinetmaking class. If there is something that you feel you will need, other than what is listed, please bring it also. You can borrow small hand tools from the school; just let us know ahead of time.

This class has a \$150.00 material fee for the dry sink cabinet that you will be working on. We will be using red oak for the project. Everyone will be using the oak that is provided by the school for this class. There is NO hardware figured in the cost of the cabinet--you need to provide your own. This cabinet will have 2 doors and 2 drawers. (The cabinet will require 22" drawer glides and overlay door hinges.)

1. Tape measure (12 or 25-ft)
2. Pencil, paper, and erasers
3. 6" engineering square, and a framing square
4. Straight bench chisels, at least a set of 4 sizes. The best sizes are; 1/4", 1/2", 3/4", and 1".
5. #474 Sandvik/Bahco scraper rectangular in shape. You will also need a glue scraper
6. Cordless drill, with hex and phillips head drivers
7. A biscuit joiner or Kreg jig if you own one. Do not buy one just for this class--you can borrow the schools.
8. Sliding "T" bevel, Japanese dovetail saw
9. Marking gauge or mortise gauge, & marking knife (utility knife)
10. Notebook for taking notes and a three ring binder and some 1/4" grid paper.
11. Safety equipment: work apron, dust mask, ear plugs, safety glasses.
12. The project will be the same dry sink that is in my Cabinetmaking video. You will not be allowed to deviate from this cabinet.
PLEASE NOTE: The focus on the week is on how to make cabinets, not how to make **A** cabinet. There will be many guest speakers and a few shop tours. Students will make a case with doors and drawers that will require some additional work once you are home.
