Over and above the tools most people possess. The following would be good to have, but not totally essential, except those marked with * to allow students to employ some of my methods.

- * 3/8" spindle gouge 988-3107
- * 1/2" spindle gouge 988-3108
- * 1.1/2 dual angle shear scraper 988-3111

- 3/4" square end/side cutting scraper 988-3106
- 3/4" round side cutting scraper 988-3109
- 1/2" skew chisel 988-3101
- 3/32" parting tool 988-3102
- 1" French curve scraper 988-3103
- 1.1/2" French curve scraper 988-3104
- 3/4" round cutaway scraper 988-3109

The following range of dual purpose radius edge/shear scrapers are excellent tools:

- 3/4" 988-1070 good for small boxes and small bowls
- 1" 988-1087
- 1.1/4" 988-1088
- 1.1/2" 988-1059

These are good for bowl interiors and open end grain vessels.

They now hold sway over the 'Key' French curve scrapers.

3/8" square beading/parting tool by various manufactures is a good tool to have.

Students might like to bring cranked or adjustable tipped scrapers for hollowing enclosed vessels. There are so many on the market these days it is down to personal preference. My own tend to be Dennis Stewart or Henry Taylor.

The vessels undertaken on this course will not be large; I envisage nothing larger than 8"x 8" most will be smaller.

Must have for the workshop:

- 1) 2oz Hot Stuff Super 'T' - instant glue
- 2) 2oz Hot Stuff NCF Accelerator
- 3) 450ml. tin Soft Paste wax – Fiddes Light Supreme wax
Maylands will do if Fiddes not available
- 4) Pint/litre **Light** mineral oil – Drug Store
