

# BANGLE BRACELETS WITH JOHN BEAVER

## SEPTEMBER 28-29, 2019

Wood bangles are great gifts and super fun to make. They're also big sellers at craft shows. This class will explore numerous ways to mount and turn bangles. You will be shown how to use store bought accessories AND how to make your own jigs to hold the bangles on the lathe. We will also spend time gluing up patterns and embellishing.

**Note:** If your wife / girlfriend / daughters / mothers (or self if you are a woman taking the class) have any solid bangles, measure the inside diameter of some of them so you can make them to fit her.

### **Student Tool List**

1/2 and 3/8 bowl gouges

Round nose scraper

Parting tool

Beading tools - optional

Compass

Pencil

Ruler

Awl

Dial Caliper - optional but helpful

Sand Paper 80-400 grit.

Embellishing accessories and tools. Bring anything you think you might like to use.

Dyes or other coloring materials

Jacobs Chuck & 2 1/4 and 2 1/2 Forstner Bits

(only bring if you have them - don't go out and purchase)

1/2" wide rubber bands. 2 1/2" is best, 3" will work too. I use Staples #84

### **Student Wood List -**

Wood blanks - Face Grain 3/4 or 4/4 (or thicker) 4 inch squares.

(Bring a variety of species. Maple, Walnut, Oak or anything you have and want to work with- figured wood and burls work well) NO EXOTICS

Veneers and Strips of wood for glue ups.

4"x4"x12" End grain blank for making jigs. Preferably Hard Maple or similar
