## Tool, supplies list

- Two Stanley cabinet scrapers # 28-035 or similar thick steel
- Set of two Lie-Nielsen cabinet scrapers (different thicknesses)
- Marking knife
- X-acto knife with # 11 blade (long pointy blade)
- Double side tape ½” wide, extra thin transparent (found in art supply stores)
- (2) 2 ½” C clamps (Jorgensen or similar)
- (2) “PeeDee” dose syringes 10 ml (oral medication dispensers) available at pharmacies
- Roll of 2” wide clear packing tape
- Block plane, Stanley or similar
- Small precision adjustable square, 4” or 6”
- 6” rule in 64<sup>th</sup> or finer
- (2) straight dividers 2”, 4”
- “Sharpie” fine point marker
- Small pair of electricians side cutters
- 4” smooth flat file
- Jeweler’s files (set of five or six) in vinyl envelop Harbor Freight, Woodcraft.
- 3/16” diameter chainsaw file.
- Lots of 2H pencils, I really like Staedtler/Mars!
