Tool List

The following tools are the basic ones which are needed to install hardware. Don't feel like you have to go out and buy any special tools for the class. You may already have many of these tools.

The following tools are recommended:

- Safety glasses
- Pencils for marking and note taking
- Ruler 12", or tape measure
- Adjustable square, 4" or 6"
- Marking gauge
- Marking knife, or X-ACTO knife with #11 blades
- Small mill file and needle files
- Sharp bench chisels; 1/4", 1/2", 3/4" and 1"
- Small mallet
- Awl
- Screwdrivers, for small flat and Phillips head screws
- Two quick grips, 6" is fine

The following tools are suggested, but not required:

- Work light and/or some type of magnifier, for ease in seeing small items
- Dremel tool with 1/8" bit
