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Bowls, Traditional, Natural Edge and Nested September 28-October 2, 2020

Overview of class

The primary focus of this class will be the turning of traditional and natural edge bowls. Also included will be nested sets, and a fried egg on a plate. Each day will start with some introductions and a demonstration. By the end of the week, each student will have improved their turning skills and have learned some good problem solving techniques. Caution, woodturning can be highly addictive!

Daily Syllabus

- Monday:** We will turn a traditional Hawaiian calabash shape bowl
Tuesday: Introduction to natural edge bowl turning
Wednesday: How to turn a sunny side up fried egg on a plate
Thursday: Introduction to natural edge nested bowl sets
Friday: Continue with nested set or any other unfinished project

Tools needed:

Face Shield with a Z87+ rating
1/2" or 5/8" Bowl gouge ("V" shape is preferred)
Curved scraper 3/4" or 1" with long handle is best
Flat scraper, 3/4" or 1" blade
Parting tool and skew chisel
Sanding supplies (discs or loose paper)
Kel McNaughton coring system (only if you have one)
Chuck with 4" or larger jaws for coring (only if you have one, some will be available)

Any other turning tools you would like to bring
