

**VENEERING: A COURSE OF ACTION FOR FURNITURE MAKING
WITH MARC ADAMS
October 12-17, 2020 (6 days)**

TOOL LIST

The following is a list of the hand tools that you should bring to the Veneering class. The class will have a \$90 material fee to cover the veneer, MDF and solid wood used in the class and other consumable supplies. There will be veneer available for purchase at the end of the class. Veneer tape will also be available to purchase at the school.

1. 3/4" Masking tape. 1 or 2 rolls, 1" wide. The blue tape is nice, but the purple tape sold online by Sure Tape CP28 is the best.
2. Tracing paper. Make sure it is very transparent (Canson brand available at Hobby Lobby or other art stores). Carbon paper or graphite paper would also be good to bring. Make sure you get the kind that is smudge resistant.
3. Several #2 pencils and erasers. You will also need at least one white pencil to mark on dark woods.
4. X-ACTO knife with many extra #11 blades.
5. Plastic or metal straight edge, 3/4" to 1" in width (no wider than 1 1/4" and no longer than 24").
6. Drafting triangles with 30-60-90 degree angles and 45-45-90 degree angles.
7. Small trim router or small Dremel tool with a plunge base. Bring a few small straight cutting router or Dremel bits for inlay work.
8. Good set of sharp chisels with at least one that is 1/8". Bring a mallet as well.
9. Bring a good bench light, some of the details will be better seen with bright lights.
10. Self healing cutting mat, available at hobby stores (24" x 36" size is best).
11. Bring a good quality seam roller, (the metal roller kind is best).
