

Open Form Boxes with Surface Design with Sharon Doughtie June 13-14, 2020

- Saturday Morning demo – turning boxes for designs on exterior and interior
Afternoon demo—carving, burning or texturing box exteriors to alter shapes and texturing interiors.
- Sunday Morning demo – painting techniques for boxes
Afternoon – wrap up.

Tool List

1. Bring your favorite turning tools. For boxes, I use a 3/8" spindle gouge for hollowing and a 3/8" bowl gouge for shaping.
2. Parting tool. Since we're painting the bowls, no need for a very thin one unless that's what you prefer to use.
3. Small square and round scrapers for making mortise and cleaning up inside of boxes.
4. Paintbrushes for painting.
 - A. a flat shader such as this one:

for both laying down paint and dry brushing
 - B. A fan brush such as this one (for dry brushing):

 - C. A liner brush for getting in tight in defined spaces:

5. Some sort of rotary carver, either a flex shaft or micro motor.
6. Sandpaper for hand sanding boxes.
7. Any safety equipment you normally use such as safety glasses, dust mask and earmuffs.
8. A pencil.

Optional Tools:

1. If you have a pyrography unit, bring it and whatever burning pens you have.
2. A reciprocating carver if you have one, such as an Automach or a Ryobi.

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
